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Infants are born with a surprising number of unlearned (innate) reflexes, that is, unlearned responses to stimuli. The Moro reflex is an outstretching of the arms and legs in response to a loud noise or sudden change in the environment. The infant's body tenses; arms are

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Among these theorists, the works of Piaget and Erikson speak most directly to the infancy period of life covered here. The average newborn infant weighs 3.4 kg (7.5 pounds) and is about 51 cm (20 inches) long. The newborn gains weight at an average of 170 to 200 g (6 to 7 ounces) per week for the first three months. Growth continues, but the rate gradually declines to an average of 60 g per week after 12 months.

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
